While the Storm Rages by Phil Earle

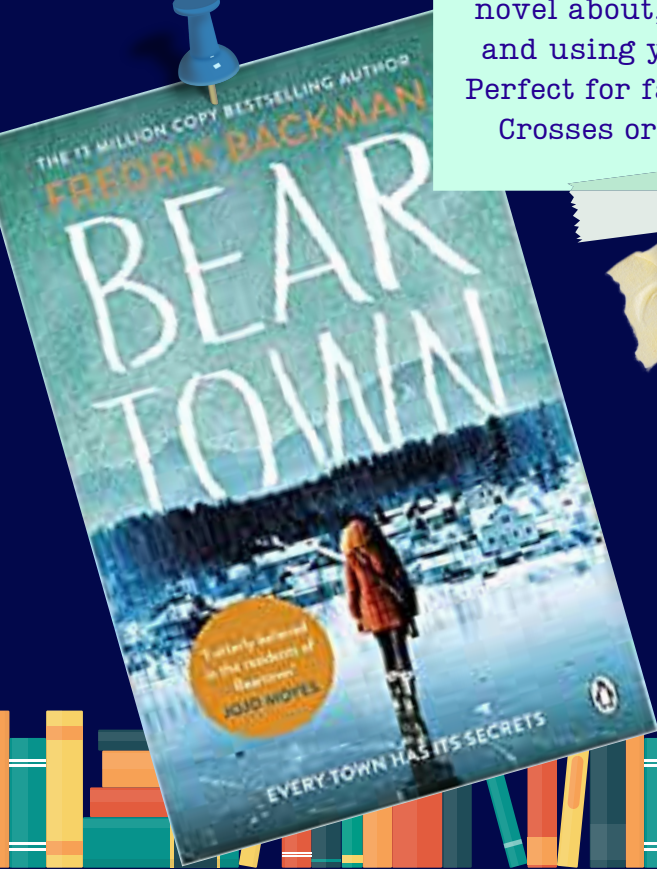
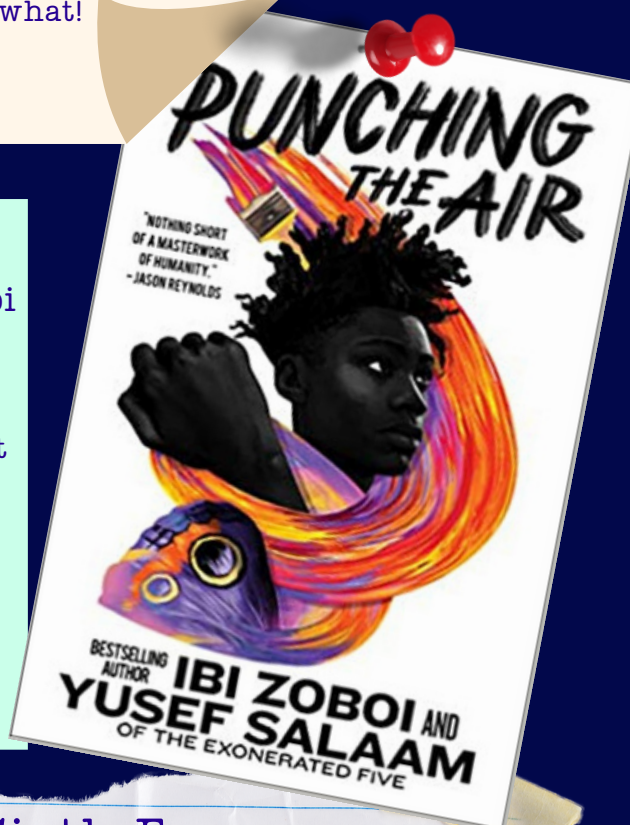
September 1939. The world is going to war!
